PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I am pleased to report that the MBA has had another excellent year. As a direct result of the strong support and contributions of its members, we have continued to meet our goals and our mission.

Our focus over the past year has been to continue with the implementation of the strategic plan, increase membership, offer improved and expanding services to members, and maintain our role as advocate of the profession. In this regard, we have continued in our efforts to lobby the Provincial Government to seek adequate funding for the legal aid system, have remained vigilant in our response to media reports that unfairly criticize judges and lawyers, and have continued our efforts to address access to justice issues. We are also aware of the often unique issues facing our members in rural and northern areas and are continuing our efforts to provide assistance.

As far as members services are concerned, we can report another unqualified success for our Mid-Winter Conference. We also had a near record turnout for Law Day, a very successful curling bonspiel and charity golf tournament, and yet another outstanding musical collaboration with RMTC.

Over the past year, and in addition to regular meetings with the Attorney General's office, with the Justice Critic, and with members of the judiciary, I had the pleasure of bringing greetings on behalf of the MBA at several events, some of which included a number of swearing in ceremonies, the Citizenship Ceremony at Law Day, the Call to the Bar Ceremony, the Robson Hall Graduation celebration, and a presentation to the Ontario Bar Association. We continue to enjoy a strong and collegial relationship with the members of the judiciary, the Law Society, the Attorney General's office

VICE-PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I was the MBA representative on the Law Society's Access to Justice Stakeholders Committee, and as well, attended the Canadian Bar Associations Summit in Vancouver on Envisioning Equal Justice.

Issues relating to access to justice will be prominent in the coming years, with the CBA taking a leadership role in addressing those issues. The CBA has released its summary report titled *Reaching Equal Justice: An Invitation to Envision and Act.*

At the time of writing this Report, the CBA is continuing its efforts on access to justice issues, by beginning the implementation process of the recommendations contained within its report.

As Vice President, I was also responsible for the oversight of Section Activity, although there was not much, if any, oversight required, given the efforts of the committed and dedicated Section leaders and of Melissa Tannahill, the Section Coordinator. Involvement in Sections is one of the important benefits to members of the MBA. The MBA will continue to tout that benefit given the excellent Section activity of the MBA. In 2012-2013, the MBA Corporate (In-House) Counsel Section name was changed to the MBA CCCA Section.

I was also the liaison between the 2013 Mid-Winter Organizing Committee and the Executive Committee. Again, the Mid-Winter Organizing Committee did an excellent job in organizing and preparing for the Mid-Winter conference held in January 2013. The Mid-Winter conference allows for lawyers to obtain all of their professional development hours, in one conference, through attendance at relevant and topical sessions. The Mid-Winter also includes an Awards Luncheon, which highlights the efforts made by the award recipients

MEMBERSHIP/MEMBER SERVICES REPORT

The Manitoba Bar Association ended off the year with 1,336 paid members. We continue to hold a variety of membership recruitment activities throughout the year. In 2012-2013, the CBA rolled out its new membership fee structure. I was also pleased to represent the branch at a variety of activities throughout the year.

At the national level, the CBA overall membership showed a gradual increase this past year. Further, the CBA National Council approved the new membership fee structure in August 2012 and it was implemented on September 1, 2012. The new fee model was designed to members' specific needs, including a group model for larger firms, a participatory model and special circumstances model. Further a Fee Structure Communications Working Group was established this past year to contribute toward the planning, development and execution of a CBA Communication Strategy and Plan. One of its initiatives includes a recruitment / retention brochure.

At the branch level, membership recruitment efforts at the outset were geared towards the future of the legal profession - law students. Active recruitment initiatives began at the law school reception during orientation week and continued with the MBA Mentorship Program event held in November 2012. Thanks to MBA Council MLSA representative, Peter Anandranistakis, for his assistance in organizing the mentorship program. We also continued to provide great value to our members again this year with a variety of continuing professional development programs, the Mid-Winter Conference and through member savings with car rental and insurance discounts to name a few.

Personal phone calls were made throughout the year to lapsed and soon to lapse members, encouraging them to renew. Welcome letters are sent to new members and new member names are published in Headnotes & Footnotes. A "Wish You

ADVOCACY AND PUBLIC **RELATIONS REPORT**

This past year was my first year as Director of Advocacy and Public Relations. It was both busy and rewarding for me.

Legislation and Law Reform: The MBA's Legislation and Law Reform Committee continues to be actively involved in reviewing provincial legislation. Their function is an important one in ensuring that the MBA and Sections, are alerted to specific legislation being tabled. On April 26, 2013, the MBA wrote a letter of support to the provincial government for Bill 26 regarding The Accessibility for Manitobans Act.

Web-Site: The MBA continues to see consistent and frequent use of our web-site by our members. The web-site continues to be an important tool in both informing our members as to what is going on, and in providing valuable resources to our members.

MBA/RMTC Lawyers Play: For many years now, the MBA and the RMTC have put on an annual fundraiser to display the talents of lawyers, judges, law professors and law students. This year's production was Legally Blonde and was a huge success. To date, the MBA has raised over \$800,000 for the RMTC. It goes without saying that the success of this production, as well as all previous productions, is due to the time, effort and energy of those MBA members participating in the production. A "Community Event" advertisement about the play was featured in the Winnipeg Free Press.

MBA Awards: It was a pleasure to participate in the selection process, to be present during the MBA Awards Luncheon held

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Were Here" postcard was developed and sent to non-members encouraging them to join. April and May 2013 were designated as "Bring a Buddy Months". Members were encouraged to bring a non-member to a Section meeting. In addition, MBA Council members participated in a membership recruitment campaign in 2012/2013.

The province unfortunately has discontinued its policy of reimbursing Manitoba Justice employees half of

Legal Directory & Day Planner: The 2013 MBA Legal directory & Day Planner was another huge success. The Directory continues to be an invaluable resource for the legal community.





EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

On January 26, 2013, the MBA Council adopted a new strategic plan. Each of the 15 CBA organizations (National, Branches and CCCA) developed respective strategic plans that all align with the priorities and strategies of the CBA strategic plan. The MBA has established initiatives to meet the five objectives outlined in the plan. The following are the highlights of some activities undertaken by the MBA in 2012-2013.

Influence and Leadership

CBA is recognized as the national and international voice of Canadian lawyers on matters of law and justice, and the advocate for the interests of its members and the legal profession.

- Representatives from the MBA met with The Hon. Andrew Swan, Attorney General on March 7, 2013.
- Members of the MBA Executive met with Reg Helwer, Justice Critic on April 4, 2103.
- The MBA continues to use the recommendations contained in our Town Hall Report to encourage changes to increase access to justice.
- The MBA Legislation and Law Reform Committee reviews legislation introduced and forwards it to Section representatives for their information and possible comments.
- Representatives of the MBA attended a consultation with the Federal Minister of Justice, Peter McKay regarding the proposed Victim's Bill of Rights.
- Yearly, representatives of the MBA meet with the Chiefs and Associate Chief Justices and Judges.
- The MBA participated in the planning for the Chief Justice of Manitoba's retirement events.
- QB Rule 74.14 was amended that increases the tariff of fess that may be charged on estates. MBA representatives have been participating on a committee regarding this charge for the past five years.
- Representatives from the MBA participated at Legal Aid management stakeholders meetings.
- The MBA President, or their representative, spoke at seven Judicial swearing-in ceremonies.
- The MBA President, or their representative, participated on two Provincial Court Judicial Nominating Selection Committees in 2012-2013. The MBA also has a representative on the Federal Justice Advisory Committee.
- Responded to attacks in the media, through letters to the editor, about the legal profession and the Judiciary.
- An open house at the Winnipeg Law Courts Building was held in Winnipeg on Sunday, April 14, 2013. The open house included: guided tours of the law courts, 23 exhibits and displays, special sitting of citizenship court, mock trials in French and English presented by elementary and senior high students, high school student debates, question and answer sessions and a demonstration by a drug detection dog and its handler. Over 1,500 people attended the open house and over 400 participated in the courthouse tours.
- An open house was also held at the Brandon Law Courts Building on Sunday, April 14, 2013 that included: legal information session, courthouse tours, exhibits and displays and a mock trial. Approximately 140 people attend the open house.

- Social media, facebook and twitter, was used to promote 2013 Law Day activities.
- The MBA, the Office of the Public Trustee and The Winnipeg Foundation presented "Will Week" from April 22-26, 2013.
- The MBA participates on the Law Society of Manitoba's Forgivable Loan Program Committee and their Access to Justice Committee.

Community

The CBA has a strong, diverse, engaged membership which reflects all sectors of the legal profession, and is the community of choice for lawyers.

- The CBA introduced a new membership fee structure that provides members with more choices, value and the opportunity to receive rebates.
- The mentorship program matched 65 law students and lawyers and held two networking events.
- The MBA hosted a reception for new law students during orientation week at the Faculty of Law and spoke to CPLED students during the first week of classes.
- The contributions of the legal profession were recognized through Awards and a "What's Happening" column in *Headnotes* & *Footnotes*.
- Branch Section Chairs attended CBA National Section/ Conference meetings.
- Section leaders', Council and Executive Committee orientation session were held.
- Executive members participated in a media training session.
- The MBA/RMTC joint production of *Legally Blonde* ran from April 24 27, 2013 at the Tom Hendry Warehouse.
- Various networking events were also held throughout the year, including the bar bonspiel and the charity golf tournament.
- Offered travel rebates for members outside of Winnipeg to attend MBA education programs in Winnipeg.
- MBA has a membership with Kids & Company Daycare. MBA members are guaranteed a full-time or part-time child care spot within six months.
- Members of the MBA Executive attended various regional bar meetings.
- Assisted the Western Manitoba Bar Association with finding a speaker for one of their education programs.

Education

CBA is a leader in professional development and ensures access to timely, high quality, relevant and affordable PD, delivered in convenient and accessible formats.

- On November 30 December 1, 2012, the MBA, the University of Manitoba Faculty of Law and The Law Society of Manitoba featured the 2012 Isaac Pitblado Lectures.
- The 2013 MBA Mid-Winter conference was held on January 24-26, 2013 and featured two full days of continuing professional development, a bench and bar reception, an exhibitor trade show and the Awards luncheon.

- In 2012-2013 a total of 2,826 members attended 79 Section meetings and sessions that provided over 133.50 hours of continuing professional development, many offered at no charge for members.
- Written materials from Section meetings are posted behind the wall on the MBA web-site.
- The MBA promoted other CBA on-line and Law Society of Manitoba continuing professional development programs.
- · Weekly decision packages are distributed to subscribers.
- Ten editions of *Headnotes* & *Footnotes* were prepared and distributed. Members can now receive the newsletter via a link on the MBA web-site instead of a paper copy. Some colour pages are now featured in the newsletter.
- The 2013 Legal Directory and Dayplanner sold out. For 2013, we sold a Legal Directory only and a Legal Directory and Dayplanner. Some other changes were incorporated in the 2013 edition based on the results of a survey done in 2012.
- The MBA web-site received approximately 4,600 "hits" each month.

Cohesion

CBA is a strong, stable, innovative, forward-looking and technologically advanced organization that is led by outstanding volunteers and staff.

Several items are worthy of note:

The audited financial statements for the MBA for the fiscal year ended August 31, 2013 prepared by Dean R. Jenkyns Chartered Accountant Ltd. follow my report. This is the first time that the financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Canadian Accounting Standards for Not-for-Profit Organizations, which the MBA adopted effective September 1, 2012.

- The aggregate of Current Assets and Investments at year-end grew from \$304,866 to \$337,869. Although Investments as a distinct asset category fell from \$234,677 to \$204,206, this was more than offset by the \$71,919 in Cash at year-end. A more detailed description of the Investments portfolio as at August 31, 2013 can be found at Note 5 to the Financial Statements.
- Aggregate revenue was up significantly from \$537,517 last year to \$557,222 this year.
- Aggregate expenses were also up, but not as much from \$559,183 last year to \$568,089 this year.

The MBA continues to be fiscally prudent and financially strong, putting it on a solid foundation for the realization of its short and long-term strategic goals.

Although I am notionally responsible for the oversight of the finances of the MBA, credit for the careful and astute manner in which those finances are actually managed belongs entirely to Executive Director, Stacy Nagle, and to her incomparable staff.

Independent Auditor's Report to the Members of Manitoba Bar Association

I have audited the accompanying financial statements of Manitoba Bar Association, which comprise the statement of financial position as at August 31, 2013 and the statements of revenues and expenditures, changes in net assets and cash flows for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accdunting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Canadian Accounting Standards for Not-for-Profit Organizations, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

My responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on my audit. I conducted my audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that I comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements. I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient. and appropriate to provide a basis for my audit opinion.

Opinion

In my opinion, the financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Manitoba Bar Association as at August 31, 2013 and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian Accounting Standards for Not-for-Profit Organizations.

Comparative Information

Without modifying my opinion, I draw attention to Note 1 to the financial statements which describes that Manitoba Bar Association adopted Canadian Accounting Standards for Not-for-Profit Organizations on September 1, 2012 with a transition

date of September 1, 2011. These standards were applied retrospectively by management to the comparative information in these financial statements, including the statements of financial position as at August 31, 2012 and September 1, 2011 and the statements of revenues and expenditures, changes in net assets and cash flows for the year ended August 31, 2012 and related disclosures. I was not engaged to report on the restated comparative information, and as such, it is unaudited.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Year Ended August 31, 2013

FIRST TIME ADOPTION OF ACCOUNTING STANDARDS FOR NOT-FOR-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS 1.

During the year the association adopted Canadian Accounting Standards for Not-for-Profit Organizations (ASNFPO). These financial statements are the first prepared in accordance with these standards. The adoption of ASNFPO had no impact on net assets as at September 1, 2011 or revenues and expenditures or cash flows for the year ended August 31, 2012 as previously reported in accordance with pre-changeover Canadian generally accepted accounting principles.

PURPOSE OF THE ORGANIZATION 2.

The Manitoba Bar Association, a branch of the Canadian Bar Association, is a non-profit organization dedicated to enhancing the economic, professional and social interests and well-being of its members throughout the province of Manitoba. The Manitoba Bar Association represents approximately 1,300 members of Manitoba's legal profession, including: lawyers, judges, law students and law professors.

SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES 3.

Fund Accounting

The Association follows the restricted fund method of accounting. Revenue and expenses related to program delivery and administration are reported in the General Fund, on an accrual basis. Purchases, sales and amortization of capital assets are reported in the Capital Fund.

Capital assets

Capital assets are stated at cost less accumulated amortization. Capital assets are amortized over their estimated useful lives at the following rates and methods: straight li Computer equipment 3 years

Computer equipment	5 years	straight-line method
Furniture and fixtures	5 years	straight-line method

The Association regularly reviews its capital assets to eliminate obsolete items.

Investments

Investments are classified as held for trading and are recorded at market value.

Revenue Recognition

Restricted contributions related to general operations are recognized as revenue of the General Fund in the year in which the related expenses are incurred. All other restricted contributions are recognized as revenue of the appropriate restricted fund.

Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue of the General Fund in the year received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably assured. Investment income is recognized as revenue of the General Fund when earned.

Fees and other income are recognized as revenue of the General Fund when the events are held and or services or products are provided.

Deferred revenue

Deferred revenue reported in the General Fund relates to annual dues received in the current year which relate to the subsequent year and revenue collected for the legal directory which will not be issued until the subsequent year.

Measurement uncertainty

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Canadian Accounting Standards for Not-for-Profit Organizations requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities, disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the period. Such estimates are periodically reviewed and any adjustments necessary are reported in earnings in the period in which they become known. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Financial Instruments

Fair Value - Fair value is the amount that would be agreed upon in an arm's length transaction between knowledgeable willing parties who are under no compulsion to act. Fair value is an estimate, which is significantly affected by the assumptions and methods used in its determination. Further, estimation of fair value involves the use of subjective judgements and uncertainty. Fair value should not be interpreted as an amount which could be realized in immediate settlement of the instruments. With the exception of investments, management has estimated that the fair value of all financial instruments approximate their cost, as there is no active market for the assets and liabilities of the association that are financial instruments. The fair value of investments is based on the quoted market values. 2013 2012

FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS 6

The association is exposed to various risks through its financial instruments and has a comprehensive risk management framework to monitor, evaluate and manage these risks. The following analysis provides information about the association's risk exposure and concentration as of August 31, 2013.

Credit Risk


Credit risk arises from the potential that a counter party will fail to perform its obligations. The association is exposed to credit risk from customers. In order to reduce its credit risk, the association reviews a new customer's credit history before extending credit and conducts regular reviews of its existing customers' credit performance. An allowance for doubtful accounts is established based upon factors surrounding the credit risk of specific accounts, historical trends and other information. The association has a significant number of customers which minimizes concentration of credit risk.

Liquidity Risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that an entity will encounter difficulty in meeting obligations associated with financial liabilities. The association is exposed to this risk mainly in respect of its receipt of funds from its customers and other related sources, long-term debt, obligations under capital leases, contributions to the pension plan, and accounts payable.

COMMITMENTS 7.

On August 1, 2012 the Association entered into a 84 month lease for its office, terminating on July 31, 2019. Annual Base rent is as follows each rental period August 1 to July 31, \$13,635.00 (2013), \$14,392.50 (2014), \$15,150.00 (2015), \$15,907.50 (2016), \$16,665.00 (2017), \$18,180.00 (2018), and \$18;937.50 (2019) plus common area costs.
